HIKING AND CLIMBING SCHEDULE

May 21-22 Pioneer Peak
 Western Chugach. Leave town late Friday. Need ice axe, crampons, helmet, basic rope handling skills. Will use running belays on exposed sections. Camp Friday night at about 5000 feet, so light pack. Class E.

May 31 Killiak Peak
 Western Chugach. Class E, 20 miles, 7000 feet elevation gain, 15+ hour day. Southeast Face. This will be a very long day with bushwhacking, devil's club, scree, loose rock, and bears. Hike 6 miles up Eagle River to Icicle Creek. Bushwhack to Icicle Glacier. Scramble up Killiak's southeast face. Participants must be competent with self-arrest, unroped exposed scrambling and rappelling. Crampons, ice ace, helmet, harness, rappel device, sturdy boots and **excellent physical condition** are

required. Group size limited to 8. No dogs, guns or whiners. Register with leader.

Training

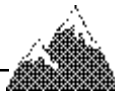
